Minutes
October 19, 2005

President Bob O. called the meeting to order at 7:04 pm.

Minutes: The minutes from the September meeting were reviewed. Corrections to be made: Sue Von Haden's name was misspelled. Brian L. will not be drawing the plans for the press box; these will need to be done by an architect. Buck W. motioned to approve the minutes as corrected, Nan K. seconded and the motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Jeanne Gill gave the report for October. Total deposits were \$2,732.00 Total payments were \$1,374.85. The current checking account balance is \$14,625.15 and total CD value is \$4,704.79. Net balance for PABC is \$19,329.94. Cheryl H. motion to accept the reports, Joe M. seconded and the motion carried.

Athletic Director's Corner: Dana Breed attended the meeting and provided an update. Green had a 3rd place finish at state. Working on a questionnaire to see if other students would be interested in joining the golf league. Cross Country will be participating a Sectionals this coming Saturday. The volleyball team had a 3rd place finish in the conference. The football team will host Wisconsin Dells this week, if they win, they will be conference champs. Poynette will be hosting the first playoff game on the 25th and possibly the next two. The soccer team finished for the season. We have been told that we cannot host regional playoffs because our field is not soccer only. Nate Leu will be holding a mandatory wrestling meeting next week. Discussion last month was to possibly help the school purchase mat lifts. This has been put on hold. The school will be building a chain link fence around the current wrestling mats to keep students from playing on them. This is only a short-term goal. The school is looking into purchasing special mats that are light weight, easier to store and are in smaller sections. These run approximately \$9000. The hockey team is looking for 2 assistant coaches. There is one student from Poynette that will be on the team, possibly two. The program is looking into a Tri-Op. Schools participating would be McFarland, DeForest and Poynette. Benefit would be less cost (\$20,000 a year now) and much better ice times for practicing. The game scheduled for the basketball team on Dec 30th at the field house has been moved to Dec 31st. No time has been announced. The Capital Conference will be holding a meeting on Dec 1.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Nekoosa Tailgate: Good turnout. Cost was \$2 per plate. Hamburger, Corn and soda were included.

- Poynette Tailgate party (Post Game Party?): \$614.61 was profited from food sales and \$176.63 from the raffle. Many brats left. Football team usually eats extra brats but due to the powder puff game being held after the homecoming game, not many football players returned to the school and the brats went to waist. It was suggested to have a committee for next year to work on the tailgate party. Post game was a success.
- Press Box Remodel: No further information at this time.
- Football playoff items: We will be taking the remainder of the unprinted towels to Ron J to have printed. Hand out a playoff games.
- Athletic Apparel: Sales were down this year, possibly due to Piggly Wiggly selling clothing also. We need to look at new ways to market clothing.
- Any Other Old Business: Mascot subject was brought up. Do we want to send a letter the school board requesting action on the mascot decision?

NEW BUSINESS:

- Hockey Program Ad: Liz L. motioned to approve a \$125.00 ad in the Hockey program, Ann R seconded. Motion carried.
- SWISS Advertising: Davy T reported that bills would be going out soon, tabled until bill received.
- Appreciation night for Boys'/Girl' Basketball: Dates were set for Jan 13th for the girls' team and Jan 14th for the boys' team. Pam S. will chair.
- Any Other New Business: Discussion regarding a website for the booster club. Davy T. will be finding out some costs to produce and maintain the website.

Brian L. motioned to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Paul K.
